

## (L) The Goat, the Mother, and the Wardrobe (1/2) [15 points]

Abkhaz is a Caucasian language predominantly spoken by around 100,000 people in the disputed territory of Abkhazia, and by a few thousand people in Turkey, Georgia, Syria, Russia, and Jordan. Among other things, it is known for having an extraordinary number of consonants (58 in the literary dialect). Here are some Abkhaz sentences in simplified transcription and their corresponding English translations. Notes: The cherkeska is an item of traditional Caucasian clothing, a single breasted collarless coat. A billy-goat is a male goat; a nanny-goat is a female goat.  $h^w$ ,  $f^w$ ,  $p'$ ,  $ch^w$ ,  $k^w$ ,  $j$ ,  $k'^w$ ,  $z^w$ ,  $k'$ ,  $c'$ ,  $t\zeta'$ ,  $x$ , and  $\varkappa$  are consonants.  $\text{ə}$  is a vowel.

Ab ajk <sup>w</sup> a aʃop'.	The billy-goat is wearing the trousers.
Atah <sup>w</sup> mada apərah <sup>w</sup> a iʃ <sup>w</sup> up'.	The old man is wearing the apron.
Abk <sup>w</sup> a ak <sup>w</sup> əmz <sup>w</sup> ək <sup>w</sup> a rʃ <sup>w</sup> up'.	The billy-goats are wearing the cherkeskas.
Aeʃk <sup>w</sup> a ak'asək <sup>w</sup> a rʃ <sup>w</sup> up'.	The squirrels are wearing the shawls.

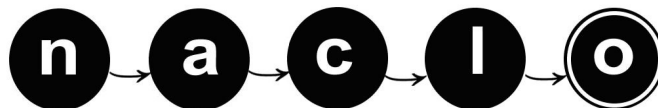
